
In 2019, DUSI saw over 6,770 hours in volunteer time donated, which is valued at \$170,381.00!

2020 RAILROAD PERSON OF THE YEAR NOMINATIONS

Nomination forms are now available at: Durand Union Station, online at www.durandstation.org, Durand City Hall, and the Durand Memorial Branch of the Shiawassee District Library. Nominations are due no later than March 1, 2020, for consideration by a selection committee (composed of former Railroad Persons of the Year) which will choose this year's honoree. To be nominated a person must be working, or have worked, for a railroad company from the surrounding Durand area. Community and church service will also be a consideration.

The Railroad Person of the Year is sponsored by Durand Union Station, Inc., in conjunction with the Durand Railroad Days Festival, to be held May 14, 15, 16, and 17 of 2020.

FEBRUARY FLASHBACK



February 20, 1852

The Michigan Southern becomes the first railroad in Michigan to run train service to Chicago, beating the Michigan Central by two months. The Grand Trunk, in comparison, did not reach Chicago until 1856. The GTW line that runs through Durand was not completed until 1880.
